Historic Site Interpreters

Description:

The WMNF operates two historic sites—The Russell Colbath House and the Brickett Place. Volunteers have the opportunity to serve as a docent interpreter at these sites, thus allowing visitors to learn the stories of these special places.



Responsibilities:

- ◆ Meet and greet forest visitors, assist with interpretive displays and programs, guide visitors through the historic sites
- ◆ One four hour shift per week desired

Desired Qualifications:

- ◆ Good judgement, ability to work independently and in a team environment
- ◆ Ability to professionally represent the WMNF by wearing a volunteer uniform
- ◆ Must have strong communication skills and ability to learn about the WMNF

Benefits:

- ◆ Ability to make a difference! - provide information to those new to the WMNF
- ◆ Flexibility to staff other historic sites, visitor centers, or information stations
- ◆ WMNF recreation pass with 16 hours of service
- ◆ America the Beautiful Pass (good nationwide) with 250 hours of service

- ◆ On the job training through WMNF staff and volunteer mentors
- ◆ Other training opportunities such as first aid / CPR, Leave No Trace training and others as appropriate and available
